Hundreds of children, teenagers and adults arrived at the University of Haifa on the evening of September 22, to participate in breaking the Guinness world record for the Largest Chemistry Lesson as part of the "Researchers' Night" events taking place at the University. Hundreds attended "Researchers' Night" at the University of Haifa, which was organized by the Division of External Relations and Resource Development alongside the Research Authority. The participants were treated to various activities that were based on the theme of the evening: chemistry as the key to scientific activity. The events focused on extracting chemistry from the laboratories into areas that we might not have expected to find interaction with this area of science.

In addition, the Ministry of Health in Ramla held a graduation ceremony for rehabilitation workers in the mental health field working according to the evidence-based intervention model – "Disease Management and Recovery" based on a doctoral thesis in the Department of Community Mental Health.

Not every day a new disc of Israeli artistic music is issued and certainly not every day a disc of artistic music of academics. But the Department of Music continues to break with conventions. The works of four exceptional composers: Dr. Yuval Shaked, Head of the Department, Prof. Eitan Steinberg, Prof. Oded Zehavi and Prof. Arie Shapira published a new disc of contemporary artistic music that reflects the variety of styles and creativity in the Department. An article in "Galeria" in Haaretz describes the new disc: "The composition of Yuval Shaked may sound odd, at least in terms of its unique structure: the piece of Shapira requires careful listening. taking a deep breath and calmness; the charm of the work of Steinberg becomes clear only through repeated and careful listening, while the piercing notes of Shapira's political work are immediately evident." Dr. Shira Zelber-Sagi, from the School of Public Health and a clinical dietician at the Livers Unit of the Tel Aviv Medical Center were interviewed for the *Reshet Bet* program "For Health" on the issue of fatty liver disease: prevalence, scanning, health risks, the close connection of drinking sugared drinks and treatment methods. Dr. Zelber-Sagi even spoke of a clinical study she is currently conducting at the Tel Aviv Medical Center which examines the effects of various types of physical activity on the fatty liver in terms of quantity of fatty liver, level of liver enzyme, metabolic equilibrium and increasing the muscle mass.



In a commentary in the "Newsweek" magazine, Prof. Fania Oz Salzberger from the Faculty of Law examined the connection between the American-Israeli relationship and the Palestinian-Israeli connection and claimed: The support of the American right is a 'bear hug' and there are many Israelis who do not welcome it".



Dr. Soli Shahvar, Director of the Meir and Miriam Ezri Center for Iran and Persian Gulf Studies was interviewed for "Voice of America" in Persian, on the Palestinian attempt to receive recognition by the UN. Also Iranian-born Dr. Mohsen Milani, Head of the International University of Miami was invited. The two experts discussed the implications of the Palestinian request in particular, as well as issues relating to the Iranian-American relationship in general.

Dr. Eli Avraham from the Department of Communication was interviewed for "Media Line" on *Tnuva*'s coping with the crisis created by the waves of social protest: "The response strategy that *Tnuva* adopted was a failure. The CEO was sent to the frontline on her own, and it was clear that she did not connect to the claims of the protesters. They should have adopted a strategy to show that they were connected to public sentiments."

Can the tensions between Turkey and the Greek part of Cyprus strengthen the Greek-Israeli relationship? Dr. Angel Chorapchiev from the program for Modern Hellenic Studies was interviewed on the topic for YNET:" I do not see a possibility of a war between Turkey and Israel or Greece – after all Turkey is a NATO member and NATO has an importance that did not exist in the past; but technically, a confrontation between Turkey and Cyprus is something that can cause a war in the whole region".

The Head of the School of Political Sciences, Prof. Eran Vigoda-Gadot, and researcher at the School, Dr. Haim Cohen, were guests on the educational show "Osim Seder" [Making Order] on Channel Two regarding a report they wrote on the policy of "Privatization & Shaping of Policy": How much should the public be involved in matters concerning the shaping of policy? "The responsibility for the management and evaluation of the process of 'democracy of litigation' and the shaping of public policy should fall on the government's shoulders and on public servants', with an aspiration towards the widest possible cooperation between citizens and members of society, within the applicable limitations entailed therein", they wrote in the report.

Is homework helpful or harmful to children? Head of the Faculty of Education Prof. Ofra Mayseless was interviewed on this topic for the "Seven Days" program of *Yediot Achronot*: "Very few children actually do their homework; most children copy and learn to lie. Everybody knows that children don't prepare homework but nothing is said. Actually, children are taught that lying is appropriate. How can this problem be solved? Reduce the amount of homework radically, but insist on preparation of the homework given" suggests Prof. Mayseless.

Did the year 5771 change Israeli society? Prof. Oz Almog from the Department of Land of Israel Studies participated in a discussion on the topic in the program "Politics" on Channel One: "We should not underestimate the protests, it certainly was an unprecedented phenomenon, but I am skeptical about its continuation. We are already used to that - after scandals things return to normal so quickly".
