The recent visit of the President of the University, Aaron Ben-Ze'ev and the Vice President for External Relations and Resource Development, Amos Gaver to Poland was accompanied by an exceptional experience: A tour of the College for Jewish and Hebrew Studies in the heart of a small picturesque Polish town. This exciting tour was part of a visit hosted by new members of the Board of Governors in Poland with the purpose to strengthen their ties with the University.



A group of twenty students from Berlin and Maastricht (Netherlands) was hosted at the University of Haifa where they enjoyed the Israeli experience first-hand. The students were guests of the University of Haifa's Model United Nations Club and were very impressed by what they saw. Some even said they would like to study at the university.



Also in this year, the Office of the Dean of Students sent a delegation of Jewish and Arab students to participate in the "Breaking the Ice" expedition and to conquer the Mont Blanc; with 4800 meters the highest mountain in Western Europe. After an exhausting, but fascinating hike, the students reached the snow-covered top from where they sent the much-anticipated message "The top is in our hands". The unique project is a cooperation of the Office of the Dean of Students, the Student Union, the Center for Sports, the Jewish-Arab Center and the Beit Hagefen - Haifa Municipality, and is financed by the Suisse non-profit-organization Coexistence.

Rats exposed to stress during early development inherit the effects of that stress to their offspring, largely expressed in behavior impairments but also characteristics of resilience, shows a new study from the University of Haifa, published in the journal Developmental Psychobiology. Providing environmental enrichment to the future mother rats had a remedial role on some of the negative effects. "The similarities between rats and humans raise the question of whether similar effects might transpire in humans; for example, exposure to war or natural disasters might have heritable effects," explains Prof. Micha Leshem who headed the study.

The Jerusalem Post reports: "If the health system wants to reduce the length of elderly patients' hospitalization and save money, the simplest way to do so is by encouraging them to walk around the wards. This is the lesson of a new University of Haifa study that found such simple exercise significantly cut the number of days these patients stayed in the hospital. 'Given the over-occupancy of many hospitals, this finding can be of great importance,' said Dr. Efrat Shadmi and Dr. Anna Zisberg of the University of Haifa's nursing department." The findings were also published in Yediot Aharonot and Globes in Israel and in the **Daily Mail** and the **Daily Mirror** in Great Britain, as well as on the official website of the British National Health Service.



Is there a connection between the riots in Great Britain and the recent protests in Israel? Prof. Dani Gutwein from the Department of History of the Jewish People was interviewed for the program *Osim Seder* on Channel Two and for <u>YNET</u>: "There is a characteristic difference between both protests: In Israel the protests are supported by the middle class, the pillar of society, whereas the protests in England involve the lower class".



Prof. Haim Kutiel from the Department of Geography and Environmental Studies was interviewed for a segment in *Yoman HaBoker* on Channel Two dealing with the report of a state comptroller on the fire in the Carmel Forest. Prof. Kutiel claimed that the extreme climatic conditions that had prevailed in the respective days had turned the task of the firefighters into an extraordinary difficulty.
